X. PROJECT / SCHEME / STUDY/SURVEY OR INNOVATIVE WORK DONE BY THE STATE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSIONS.

1. Assam i) Adoption of scaling procedure

The Commission has been experiencing from the earlier examinations that evaluation by examiners in some of the optional subjects found to be not “Uniform” because of the fact that some examiners were “strict” while the others were “lenient” in awarding marks. Therefore, candidates taking the optional subjects like Science/Mathematic/Engineering subjects were found to have scored higher marks compared to the subjects in humanities like Political Science, Economics, History, Education etc. taking into consideration the above and in order to achieve “uniformity in standards of evaluation of the descriptive answer scripts” (optional subjects), as stated above, the APSC stressed the need to devise a procedure of scaling/normalization/moderation to ensure equitable treatment to all candidates and to judge them on merit by reducing the “examination variability” to the extent possible.

Accordingly, the APSC requested the Director IIT, Guwahati to extent all possible help and cooperation in this regard and also some of the State PSCs to share necessary information on adopting scaling procedures etc.

A high level committee has already been constituted to monitor the progress of the scaling procedures in consultations with the IIT, Guwahati and the concerned State PSCs in order to devise the procedure at the earliest.

ii) Equivalence Committee

In response to the advertisements, the Commission receives large number of applications with various academic Degrees/Diplomas conferred by Govt./Private institutions of the country and even outside the country. While scrutinizing of such applications, the Commission is often put to great difficulties to ascertain the suitability/equivalence or otherwise of such Degrees. This takes away considerable time to the Commission leading to delay in recruitment process and court cases. But an Equivalence Committee will go a long way in ameliorating the problems and to advise the Commission on equivalence of various academic degrees conferred by Gov./Private Academic Institutions in matters of employment/recruitment to services and posts of the Government.

In this connection, the APSC has already taken necessary steps by constituting a Core Committee comprising representative from the concerned Universities of Assam/Government of Assam/IIT, Guwahati etc. This will greatly empower APSC for hassle free scrutiny of applications in the days to come.

iii) Elimination of wrong answer keys

The wrong answer keys issues led to the Commission's embroilment in some of the recruitment examinations including the premier CCE, 2018. This makes it amply clear that the entire examinations process can not be made error free without the help and active cooperation of different other agencies including the professors of universities/colleges of Assam including IIT, Guwahati which act as a pool of our question setters, examiners, moderators, tabulators, scrutinizers and so forth.

In order to do away with the imbroglio, the Commission has already taken adequate measures. For the purpose, the Commission after the screening tests etc. uploads the official answer keys inviting objection, if any, from all concerned and thereafter consults its empanelled designated experts for their comments/opinions on the objections received/doubts on the official answer keys published and thus final answer keys are framed. Further, the Commission takes utmost efforts while finalizing the answer keys, without any error/discrepancy, on the basis of which results are prepared.

iv) Uploading of OMR Sheets

APSC is seriously pursuing the matter of uploading of OMR sheets on the same day of holding of examination and this will be in transparency in the system. For the purpose, the matter has been taken up with the Government of Assam for necessary assistance etc.

v) Training to officers and staff of APSC

The officers and staff of the Commission are required to perform certain functions mandated by the Constitution and as such they are expected to be well conversant with the provisions of the Constitution and the legal implications pertaining to Service Rules and Office Procedure. Therefore, for smooth and efficient functioning of the Commission, the officer and staff should be equipped with thorough concepts on the above and hence vigorous training inputs on such matters are the need of the hour to deliver proper advice and suggestions to the Commission. Further, the Commission has already taken all reformative

measures to accelerate the recruitment processes in line with UPSC and other State Public Service Commission.

Keeping in view the above aspects in mind, the Commission is contemplating to impart training to the officers and staff of the Commission by reputed experts in the respective fields in a phases manner for its efficient functioning and to meet the challenges of the day.

vi) The APSC launched an online recruitment portal.

2. Himachal Pradesh

Himachal Pradesh PSC has developed a standard ICT solution for all recruitment related activities and other functions. The initiative has been undertaken under HPPSC Meity project funded by World Bank, which is to be replicated in other PSCs. The software modules developed have been successfully hosted and has been implemented in June, 2020. This is a step towards complete automation of office procedures of HPPSC. A user friendly candidate registration portal has been developed which is linked to email & SMS gateway, all the advertisements being published are visible to candidate on his dashboard and it also includes the programme for settling the candidate queries etc. Candidate can apply through his profile without having the need to upload his documents time and again. Complete record of candidates's transactions of business with HPPSC is maintained in the portal. Direct-Recruitment-Module has the functionality starting from receipt of requisitions from Govt. Departments to publishing of advertisements till generation of merit list etc. Modules for conduct of DPC, Advisory role and R & P Rules etc are under development. As such it is a complete solution. The system is being refined further every day.

3. Karnataka

The Commission has introduced the following method to obtain passing certificate of candidates pertaining to Departmental Examination during the period:-

“Candidates have to visit KPSC website <http://kpsc.kar.nic.in> and link their Digilocker Account to their Adhar Number. Login with username as their Registration Number and password as their PAN card number entered in the application of Departmental Examination for issuing of passing certificate.

The concerned departments can also verify the Genuinity of the passing certificate through the URL: <http://sevasindhu.karnataka.gov.in/KPSC> Genuine Certificate entering the register number of candidates. These Certificate have digital signature of the Controller of Examination. Hence, the concerned departments not necessary to send the passing certificate for verification. “

4. Kerala
- i) Biometric Service verification system introduced to identify the candidates.
 - ii) Confirmation using OTP for examinations.
 - iii) On screen marking for valuation
 - iv) Introduction of new software for service verification.
5. Maharashtra
- i) Number of Attempts/ Opportunities:- The Commission has decided to limit the number of attempts/opportunities to the candidates appearing for the various competitive examination. The maximum number of attempts/ opportunity for the candidates appearing in the various competitive examination conducted by the Commission, as per decision is as follow:-
 - 1) Candidates belonging to the Open (General) category are allowed maximum six attempts/ opportunities.
 - 2) The maximum attempts/ opportunities limit shall not be applied to the candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes categories.
 - 3) The remaining backward class candidates are allowed maximum nine attempts/ opportunities.
 - ii) Negative Marking System:- The Maharashtra PSC is adopting universal procedure for the implementation of negative marking system for the various objective type competitive examinations.
 - 1) 25% or $\frac{1}{4}$ marks shall be deducted from the total marks for each wrong answer.
 - 2) If more than one answer to a question is given, the same is treated as wrong answer and 25 % or $\frac{1}{4}$ marks shall be deducted.
 - 3) If the sum of the total final marks, turn out to be in fractions, it will remain in fractions and further action will be taken accordingly, while adopting the above procedure.
 - 4) If the answer to a question is not attempted, in such a case, the procedure of negative marking shall not be applied.
6. Odisha
- i) Computer Based Recruitment Examination (CBRE)
 In the pandemic situation created by COVID 19, the Commission has decided to make the examination process contact-less as far as possible by implementing **Computer Based Recruitment Examination (CBRE)**. This will cut down many pre and post examination activity, thereby injecting efficacy, transparency, security to the existing system. This is also environment friendly and cost effective solution. We can also get instant evaluation for faster results. This CBRE examination basically utilizes automated system controls and minimizes the manual efforts, for which it is more robust, reliable, and accurate than the offline examination.

ii) Examination Audit of Conduct of Examination

Commission always strives upon conduct of the examination in a purely transparent manner along with provision of all amenities to the candidates. Earlier Commission entirely depends upon the District Administration for conduct of examination. However, to safeguard and confirm the conduct of examination as per standards set aside by the Commission, now a software application “Examination Audit and Compliance” has been developed with Mobile and web Interface. The independent auditors visits the examination centre on the day before the exam and on the day of exam to confirm the arrangements and execution of exam as per Commission standards fitted into their hand held devices. On getting the Controller of Examination, they raise alerts which is transmitted to the zone coordinators through the Controller of Examination, so that the discrepancy is immediately addressed and Commission rest assures about fair conduct of the Examination.

iii) Physical Verification of Documents Eliminated

Verification of Original documents is an integral part of the recruitment, wherein the counterfeit/fake candidature is identified and excluded from the recruitment process. In the pandemic situation created by COVID 19, it was always risky for the candidates to come down to the office of the Commission and get them verified. To overcome this, provision was made by the Commission to upload the documents in the secured web framework for digital verification and assessment.

iv) Online Public Grievances System

Gone are those days where a petitioner has to cross several tens/hundreds of kilometers to lodge a grievance/petition to the Commission. Now with the implementation of web based application software “Online Public Grievances System” the candidates/general public lodges complain at touch of a button by staying anywhere in the globe and gets regular alert about its status. The grievances is efficiently tracked and resolved by appropriate authorities. The entire activity is monitored by superior officers.

v) Automation of promotion & Disciplinary Wings of OPSC

As per the provision of the Constitution of India, the Commission is to be consulted on promotion/disciplinary matters of the civil servants of the State.

The current modes of operandi to discharge the above mentioned duties by the Commission are entirely manual, which leads to the issues as under: -

- a) Incomplete reference of cases to the Commission by the line Departments
- b) Delayed reference/response to the Commission by the line Departments
- c) Timely receipt of acceptance from the line Departments
- d) Availability of complete documents for ready reference at the Commission
- e) Availability of ready MIS and alerts for quick & informed decision making.

In view of the above & keeping Govt.'s policy, the Commission had identified two prominent areas for automation such as promotion & disciplinary wings, through rapid introduction of technology to discharge the duties in more efficient, transparent & timely manner.

The project "Automation of Promotion & Disciplinary Wings" of OPSC involves integrated & seamless discharge of duties through automation of workflow, back end digitization, integration and process redesigning, documents management across participating sections of the Commission & line user departments of the Govt.

It is a web based application developed by Odisha Computer Application Centre (OCAC), Technical Directorate of E&IT Department, Govt. of Odisha and hosted securely at Odisha State Data Centre (OSDC). The newly developed system will help the OPSC to adopt more organized way of disposing the matters related to Promotions & Discipline, augment the capacities of OPSC & user Department officials, removal of redundant process, reduces timeline for processing the files with large records; its quick retrieval generation of MIS and alerts after laid down threshold period; for better decision making.

7. Rajasthan i) SSO Based Online Detailed Application Form, August, 2020.

Presently Detail application/ forms are invited from the candidates who declared successful provisionally in written exam for either for interview or final selection. Candidates download the detailed application form from Commission's website and submit the hard copy duly filled in the Commission's office.

Now the integration has been made on state Recruitment portal

to submit the detail application cum scrutiny form online through the portal. The above process has also been integrated with document verification and e- vault, therefore, one time verification of document may be made possible in future.

Benefit to Commission

This will help the candidates to submit their detail application cum scrutiny form online. Scrutiny of application form may be made online by the office and status for application form and any shortcomings in the form may be made available to the candidates through SMS. This will help to expedite the process.

ii) Map on Admit Card via SSO Portal, August, 2020.

After mapping of GIS locations of exam centres in the State, RPSC has integrated this with State Recruitment Portal and State owned GIS application for providing Exam Centre MAP from nearest Railway/ Bus Stand to the Exam Centre. This was also earlier implemented on existed RPSC online Portal till 2017 for a few online Exam Centres. Now, admit card alone with Exam centre map will be made available to candidates.

Benefits to Commission

This module gives an approximate view to candidates of their exam centre's distance from nearest railway station / bus stand.

8. Tripura

i) Upgradation of the website of the Commission:

The website of the Tripura Public Services Commission has been upgraded and website is now more user friendly and user oriented.

ii) Introduction of new examination centre at Ambasa and Dharamnagar for major examination as TCS & TPS GR-II;

In order to cater to the needs of candidates from remote locations, new examination centre at Ambasa, Dhalai district was opened in 2019, another new examination centre at Dharamnagar was opened in the year 2020.

(3) ADDRESS AND OTHER DETAILS
